
## Poultry sustainability related to

## Efficiency OR Robustness

- Chickens: Efficient converters of feed to meat
- ▶ No methane produced from digestion



- Agriculture that follows nature
- Nutrient cycling
- Diversity and interactions
- Does not depend on fossil fuels



Large-scale

OR Small- and medium-scale

## Continuous improvement of poultry production

#### Large-scale, intensive

- World-wide
- Energy-efficient housing
- Controlled environment
- Fast-growing genetics
- High performance feed
- Targeted health care
- Centralized slaughter at large facilities
- Economies of scale

#### Small- and mid-scale, ecological

- Bioregional production (local and regional)
- Open housing
- Access to outdoors
- Differentiated genetics
- Alternative feeds and feeding
- ▶ Holistic health
- De-centralized slaughter at small facilities
- Resilience, robust

## Intensive chicken meat production



## Ecological Chicken Production

- Stationary houses with outdoor access
- Small portable houses on pasture
- ▶ Shelters
